Letter from the Pastor-Kevin Young, C.L.P.

Last week I preached on “The Wisdom of God”, that being the life and teachings of Christ Jesus. The lesson opened with readings from Leviticus 19:1-2, 9-19 and 1 Corinthians 3:10-11, 16-23. Leviticus tells us God’s law given to Moses for all of Israel. This particular reading gives us a list of “Do Nots” for all the community to obey. These “Do Nots” seem straight forward enough so what’s the big deal? God’s people have not been living according to God’s law; therefore God must remind Israel yet again of their calling and responsibility as His chosen people.

Fast forward to the New Testament, 1 Corinthians 3 where we find Paul teaching in the church at Corinth. Paul starts by telling how the foundations have been laid by an expert builder not just the foundations of their building but of the True Church, the teachings of Christ Jesus. Again we find some “do not” type statements mixed into Paul’s lesson. Why have I told you this? Because as God’s chosen we have certain standards we must live by if we are to live a Christian life pleasing to God, and Christ Jesus.

We live in a world of sin and it is getting worse every day. All one needs to do is open the daily newspaper to read just how far we have strayed from what is good and pleasing to God. So when was the last time you were told as Moses told Israel to get our act together? Pastors today are afraid to preach so boldly for fear of losing what few people show up on a Sunday morning. For the record nowhere was I ever taught or told that we need only worship God once a week or that Sunday services can only be 1 hour long or that we can’t pray too much because it makes the congregation uneasy. Luke 9:23 says; “if anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily and follow Me”. Did you catch the “DAILY” part?

Perhaps you have heard the story of the doctor who gave an exercise program to a man recovering from open-heart surgery. He instructed the patient to “follow the program religiously”. After six weeks, the man returned for a check-up. The doctor asked how the exercise program was progressing, the patient replied, “Well, at first it was kind of tiring doing all the exercises once a week.” The doctor was shocked. “I wanted you to do them every day, not just once a week!” he exclaimed. The patient calmly replied, “but you said do them religiously. So just like going to church, I did them once every seven days.” This beloved, is the new Christian mentality; less is enough.

As I set down today to begin this article I was looking through my mail and there in front of me was an ad for a “Ministry Conference” and one of the guest speakers was going to talk on the subject “Religionless Christianity”. What the heck is that about? The idea is to develop a type of “Religionless Christianity” in our communities as an alternative to regular church. Need I say more; this is what’s wrong with our country! God-less Christianity is nothing, it doesn’t even make sense to me but to new believers looking for a quick fix, they will flock to this easy out in droves. It won’t be until it’s too late that they see they have wasted their lives for nothing. This makes our job as believers, called by God to share the Good News even harder than it already is. It is time to stand up and be heard, to spread the word of God, the Good News of Christ Jesus, or be damned with the rest of society.

As you and I follow Jesus today, I pray we will see ourselves in the spiritual position Paul states in Colossians 3:3- “For you died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God.” And as we see ourselves in Christ, may we re-orient ourselves to His standard of taking up our cross daily for in the spiritual realm, the very health of our spiritual life and destiny depends on our daily walk with Christ!

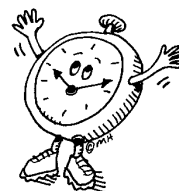
Love in a Basket & Baby Hats

Daylight Savings Time begins Sunday, March 12. Remember to turn your clock forward 1 hour before bed!

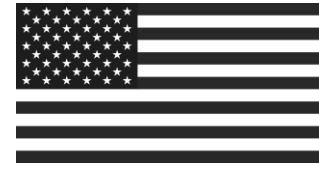
